## **Foundation Update**

The Foundation has been busy managing the Foundation's investments and encouraging church committees to apply for additional funds to further God's work. Here is a quick summary of our activities:

We decided to pay a double payment on the Texas Street improvement as the bond is still at around 6% interest. By paying double payments, we can reduced the life of the loan by more than 50%.

We reinvested \$10,000 in

a bond fund to provide better balance to investments.

We are developing a new educational brochure on the Foundation.

We asked for congregational support for our in-care seminary student, with the Foundation matching contributions.

We rolled over Washington Federal CD.

We received applications from the Share Christ's Word Team (Christian Education) and Building and Grounds Committee.
